



Fraser River Basin

 Fraser River flows ~1400km from Mt Robson to Vancouver

- Area is about 220,000km²
- Population is 2.8 million and growing
- Contributes 80% of BC's economy
- Five regions within the Basin
 - Upper Fraser
 - Cariboo-Chilcotin
 - Thompson
 - Fraser Valley
 - Greater Vancouver-Sea to Sky







Upper Fraser Region

- 78 164 km² or 7 816 400 hectares
- 4.2% of the Fraser basin's population (108 940)
- Economic base is forestry, with agriculture, transportation, mining and tourism
- Includes 5 of 13 communities in BC most vulnerable to the forest sector
- Highest water quality in the basin
- Air quality in Prince George for PM2.5 exceeds the Canada-Wide Standard






Upper Fraser – Greater Prince George Chilako River - Cows AND Fish Program



Mountain Pine Beetle:


- Omineca Beetle Action Coalition economic diversification

Economy – estimated 3500+ jobs lost in northern BC – mill closures due to low prices, drop in demand (USA mortgage lending crisis) Bioenergy – several plants proposed in the region and northern BC



BC Rivers Day

- The local BC Rivers Day event has become one of the largest in BC
- The BC Rivers Day Music Festival draws 3500-4000 residents
- Features musicians and First Nations performers, educational displays, and children's activities
