### Background

- Difficult for A'Tlegay Fisheries Society to provide in-season information to Member Bands.
  - No timely in-season information.
  - Affected management of A'Tlegay FSC fisheries.
  - Unable to determine if catch targets were met.
  - Difficult to track permits that were being issued.
  - Difficult to track the distribution of communal catch.

### Background

- Difficult to provide post-season information to DFO
  - Aboriginal Fishery Strategy (AFS) Communal Licence requires annual reporting of catch and effort to DFO.
  - This requirement was being met, however the data had to be compiled manually, taking a substantial amount of time.
  - No near real time in-season information was available from A'Tlegay and could only be provided post season.

- System Development
  - Phase I (2000-2002)
    - Handheld computers → Satellite → DFO
  - Phase II (2003)
    - MS-Access database (internal reports) → Internet → DFO
  - Phase III (2005 present)
    - Deployment to other coastal First Nations fisheries organizations
  - Phase IV (2008 2009)
    - FSWP/FBC Project Deployment to Fraser First Nations



## Database Mgmt system overview:

- ✓ Issue Permits
  (or Designation Cards)
- ✓ Record Catch
- √ Summarize Data
- ✓ Generate Reports
- √ Export Data





#### Benefits

- First Nations
  - Elevate management role of First Nations in keeping with rights, interests and responsibilities regarding fisheries for First Nations (see Our Place at the Table)
  - Reporting system provides timely FSC catch information to the First Nations
  - Allows First Nations to electronically track their own fishers catch and deliveries.
- DFO
  - Timely raw FSC catch data uploaded in a standard format.
  - The working relationship between A'Tlegay and local DFO staff has been strengthened considerably.

- System requirements
  - Hardware
  - Software
  - Hi-speed Internet connection
- Personnel requirements
  - Fisheries Database Administrator (DBA)
    - Computer-savvy
      - data, databases, spreadsheets, email
- Budget
  - A'Tlegay Fisheries Society (through FSWP/Living Rivers) provides:
    - Database (software)
    - Start-up Tasks: installation, training, technical support
  - FN Fisheries Office provides:
    - Personnel (DBA)
    - Long-term database maintenance and customization
